THE ACADEMIC COSTUME AND THE MEANING OF THE HOOD

The colorful attire worn by the graduates, the $0i \neg T = \hat{E}qi_qi0 = \hat{V}$ occasion of Commencement Exercises has historic roots in the distant medieval past. Dressed as they are in cap and gown, the graduates and their professors form a part of a long tradition which dates back to Paris and Bologna, to Oxford and Cambridge.

The precise origins of the several parts of the medie-val students enjoyed the status of clerics during their university years, however, one is hardly wrong in asserting that their attire found its inspiration in the clerical dress of medieval robe of the friar or priest, and the hood, of the monk's or friar's cowl. The mortar-board of today, the end product of a curious evolution, recalls the or edging of the hood, in different widths for skull cap of days when tonsured heads needed

Academic attire began to appear quite generally on United States campuses in the late 1890's. Since that time, its use has become universal -for sole min university functions, and its pattern highly uniform.
