# Purpose




Q3. How useful are the services provided through CADR (academic and housing accommodations, testing centers, general advising, assistive technology etc.)?

Display information on how to use DocuSign with accommodation forms

#### Addressing Feedback Themes

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When students are initially approved for academic accommodations, a instructor notication email is also sent to the list of instructors for student's registered courses at that time. In the body of the email, there are instructions for those course instructors on how to not the approved accommodations in Banner.

DocuSign, CADR has provided how-to videos and user guides on the ocewbsite, specifically for using the Out of Class Testing (OCT) Form and Rescheduled Exam Request (RER Form). Since these are the most widely used forms, these videos and guides are readily available.
